# Doctoral studies at MDH/in Sweden

#### Doctoral studies at MDH

- MDH was given the right to issue doctorates in the year 2001
- Approximately 150 doctoral students
- 9 postgraduate programs (Computer science, Electronics, Innovation and Design, Energy and environmental engineering, Mathematics/Applied mathematics, Biotechnology/Chemical engineering, Industrial economics and organization, Didactics, Working life studies.)

 Computer science has the largest postgraduate program (approximately 50 Phdstudents)

#### Terms and conditions

- In Sweden its free of charge to study for doctors degree, you even get paid for doing it
- Limited positions a doctoral student (In 2007 only 19 doctoral students was enrolled)
- A doctoral student have the same rights as anyone employed by the university
- Monthly salary of about 2300 euro

- A postgraduate program takes ideally 4 years of fulltime study (1/3 courses and 2/3 dissertation)
- Most students studies 80% on the postgraduate program and does 20% departmental duties

### How to get enrolled?

- Only future Phd-students who can be offered supervision and acceptable conditions for their studies in other respects can be enrolled.
- On enrolment each Phd-student is to be assigned a group of supervisors comprising a principal supervisor and one or more assistant supervisors. (One of these have to have special training for supervisors according to the law)

 The principal supervisor has the overall responsibility for the Phd-student's study program. The assistant supervisors can take on the direct supervision or provide different subject expertise, where interdisciplinary research is involved, for instance.  The hard part is always to get funds for the Phd-students. The University is obligated to pay their salaries for 4 years  It's obligatory (according to law) that the supervisors write an individual study plan (syllabus) together with the Phd-student before enrolment. Afterwards the study plan has to be updated every year and signed by the supervisors and the PHD-student. The study plan contains information on activity, both in the postgraduate program and other activities etc.

## Things to think about for a future collaboration

- An agreement have to be made by MDH and the other university
- Types of financing: who are going to pay, for what periods, how much money?
- Expenses: Travels, conferences etc, who is going to pay?

- Supervision, the principal supervisor have to be approved by the faculty board at MDH
- Immaterial rights: Who owns the results, patents etc?
